WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Grimshaw deems it expedient to provide for the control and management of traffic for the protection of life and property within the Town, and


WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Grimshaw deems it expedient to provide for the consolidation of the Town of Grimshaw Traffic Bylaw No. 759 and amendments thereto, to provide for the control and management of traffic.


NOW THEREFORE pursuant to the authority of the Municipal Government Act Section 110, 153, and 172(3) Chapter M-26, R.S.A. 1980 and amendments thereto; and the Highway Traffic Act, Section 16, Chapter H-7, R.S.A. 1980 and amendments thereto; and the Motor Transport Act, Section 14, Chapter M-20, R.S.A. 1980 and amendments thereto; the Council of the Town of Grimshaw hereby enacts as follows:

This Bylaw may be cited as "The Town of Grimshaw Traffic Control and Management Bylaw" as per Schedules A and B attached hereto, which shall be, and form part of this bylaw.

This Bylaw shall upon third and final reading, rescind Bylaws No. 934,783, 805 and Bylaw No. 759 of the Town of Grimshaw.



DEFINITIONS

Wherever in this bylaw the following terms are used, unless the context requires otherwise, they shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section,

1. "air cushion vehicle" means a vehicle designed to derive support in the atmosphere primarily from the expulsion of air from the vehicle;
- 1.1 "alley" means narrow highway intended chiefly to give access to the rear of buildings and parcels of land;
2. "antique motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle that is 25 years of age or older, is owned as a collector's item and is operated solely for use in exhibitions, club activities, parades and other similar functions and is not used for general transportation;
- 2.1 "bicycle" means, except in Parts 2 and 5 of the Highway Traffic Act, a cycle propelled by human power on which a person can ride, regardless of the number of wheels it has, and includes a vehicle that
 - (a) may be propelled by muscular or mechanical power,
 - (b) is fitted with pedals that are continually operable to propel it,
 - (c) weighs not more than 35 kilograms,
 - (d) has a motor that produces not more than 750 watts and that is driven by electricity or has an engine displacement of not more than 50 cubic centimeters,
 - (e) has no hand-operated or foot-operated clutch or gearbox driven by the motor that transfers power to the driven wheel, and
 - (f) does not have sufficient power to enable it to attain a speed greater than 35 kilometers per hour on level ground within a distance of 2 kilometers from standing start;
3. "boulevard" means, in an urban area, that part of a highway that
 - (a) is not a roadway, and
 - (b) is that part of the sidewalk that is not especially adapted to the use of or ordinarily used by pedestrians;
- 3.1 "center line" means
 - (a) the center of a roadway measured from the curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the roadway,
 - (b) in case of a highway designated by traffic control devices
 - (i) as an offset center highway, or
 - (ii) as a highway having a certain number of traffic lanes for traffic moving in a certain direction at all times or at specified times,

the line dividing the lanes for traffic moving in opposite directions, or

 - (c) in the case of a divided highway, that portion of the highway separating the roadways for traffic moving in opposite directions;

4. "commercial vehicle"
- (a) means a truck, trailer or semi-trailer, except
 - (i) a truck, trailer, or semi-trailer that is a public service vehicle, or
 - (ii) a truck, trailer, or semi-trailer or any class of vehicle that by the regulations or by an order of the Alberta Motor Transport Board is exempted from being classified as a commercial vehicle,
 - (b) includes
 - (i) a motor vehicle from which sales are made of goods, wares, merchandise or commodity, and
 - (ii) a motor vehicle by means of which delivery is made of goods, wares, merchandise or commodity to a purchaser or consignee thereof;
5. "crosswalk" means
- (a) that part of a roadway at an intersection included within the connection of the lateral line of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the roadway, or
 - (b) any part of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by signs or by lines or by other markings on the road surface;
6. "daytime" means the period commencing one hour before sunrise and ending one hour after the following sunset;
7. "dealer" means any person who buys or sells motor vehicles as a business, either as principal or agent;
8. "Department" means the Department of Transportation;
9. "driver" or "operator" means a person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle;
10. "highway" means any thoroughfare, street, road, trail, avenue, parkway, driveway, viaduct, lane, alley, square, bridge, causeway, trestleway or other place, whether publicly or privately owned, any part of which the public is ordinarily entitled or permitted to use for the passage or parking of vehicles, and
- (a) includes
 - (i) a sidewalk (including the boulevard portion of the sidewalk),
 - (ii) if a ditch lies adjacent to and parallel with the roadway, the ditch, and
 - (iii) if a highway right of way is contained between fences or between a fence and one side of the roadway, all the land between the fences, or all the land between the fence and the edge of the roadway, as the case may be,
- but
- (b) does not include a place declared by the Lieutenant Governor in Council not to be a highway;

11. "implement of husbandry" means a vehicle designed and adapted primarily for agricultural, horticultural or livestock raising operations;
12. "intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of
 - (a) the lateral curb lines or, if none,
 - (b) the exterior edges of the roadways.or 2 or more highways which join one another at an angle whether or not one highway crosses the other;
13. "judge" means a judge or justice of the peace;
14. "median" means a physical barrier or area that separates traffic traveling in one direction from traffic traveling in the opposite direction on the highway;
15. "Minister" means the Minister of Transportation and Utilities;
16. "moped" means a vehicle, regardless of the number of wheels it has, that
 - (a) may be propelled by muscular or mechanical power,
 - (b) is fitted with pedals that are continually operable to propel it,
 - (c) weighs more than 35 kilograms but less than 55 kilograms,
 - (d) has a motor that is driven by electricity or has an engine displacement of not more than 50 cubic centimetres,
 - (e) has no hand-operated clutch or gearbox driven by the motor transferring power to the driven wheel, and
 - (f) does not have sufficient power to attain a speed greater than 50 kilometers per hour on level ground within a distance of 2 kilometers from a standing start;
17. "motor cycle" means a motor vehicle mounted on 2 or 3 wheels and includes those motor vehicles known to the trade as motor cycles and scooters but does not include an off-highway vehicle as defined in the Off-highway Vehicle Act;
18. "motor vehicle" means
 - (a) a vehicle propelled by any power other than muscular power, or
 - (b) a moped,but does not include a bicycle, an aircraft, a tractor, whether equipped with rubber tires or not, an implement of husbandry or a motor vehicle that runs only on rails;
19. "multi-purpose passenger vehicle" means a vehicle that has a seating capacity of 10 or less and is constructed on a truck-chassis or with special features for off-highway operation, but does not include an air cushion vehicle, an all terrain vehicle as defined in the Off-highway Vehicle Act, a passenger car or a truck;
20. "municipality" means the Town of Grimshaw in the Province of Alberta.
21. "night time" means the period commencing one hour after sunset and ending one hour before the following sunrise;

22. "operator's license" means a license to operate a motor vehicle issued pursuant to the Motor Vehicle Administration Act;
23. "owner" includes any person renting a motor vehicle or having the exclusive use of it under a lease or otherwise for a period of 30 days;
24. "park", when prohibited, means allow a vehicle (whether occupied or not) to remain standing in one place, except
 - (a) when standing temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading passengers, or
 - (b) when standing in obedience to a peace officer or traffic control device;
25. "parking lane" means that portion of a primary highway between
 - (a) the edge of the roadway to the right of the direction of traffic, and
 - (b) the nearest solid white line (not being the center line) marked on the roadway;
26. "Passenger loading or unloading space" means a space on the vehicle portion of a highway marked with an authorized sign permitting parking therein for the period necessary to load or unload passengers, provided such period is five minutes or less;
27. "passenger car" means a motor vehicle that has a seating capacity of 10 or less but does not include an off-highway vehicle, a truck, a multi-purpose passenger vehicle, a chassis cab, a moped or a motor cycle;
28. "peace officer" means
 - (a) a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police,
 - (b) a member of a municipal police force,
 - (c) a special constable,
 - (d) a patrol officer of the Department of the Solicitor General, or
 - (e) a park warden appointed pursuant to the National Parks Act (Canada), while he is in the exercise or discharge of his powers or duties in a national park established under that Act;
29. "pedestrian" means a person afoot or a person in a wheel chair;
30. "person", if the context so requires, shall include a corporation;
31. "power bicycle" means a vehicle that
 - (a) may be propelled by muscular or mechanical power,
 - (b) is fitted with pedals that are continually operable to propel it,
 - (c) weighs not more than 35 kilograms,
 - (d) has a motor that produces not more than 750 watts and that is driven by electricity or has an engine displacement of not more than 50 cubic centimeters,

- (e) has no hand-operated or foot-operated clutch or gearbox by the motor that transfers power to the driven wheel, and
 - (f) does not have sufficient power to enable it to attain a speed greater than 35 kilometers per hour on level ground within a distance of 2 kilometers from a standing start;
32. "primary highway" means a highway designated as a primary highway pursuant to the Public Highways Development Act;
33. "public service vehicle" means
- (a) a motor vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer operated on a highway by or on behalf of a person for compensation, whether that operation is regular or only occasional or for a single trip, and
 - (b) includes a motor vehicle kept by a person for the purpose, subject to the regulations, of being rented without a driver, but
 - (c) does not include a motor vehicle used solely as an ambulance or hearse or for the transportation of the Royal Mail;
34. "roadway" means that part of a highway intended for use by vehicular traffic;
35. "Safety Branch" means the Transportation Safety Branch of the Department of Transportation;
36. "service brake" means the primary mechanism designed to stop a vehicle;
37. "service road" means a road that runs parallel to a main road and is separated from the main road by a boulevard or curb;
38. "sidewalk" means that part of a highway especially adapted to the use of or ordinarily used by pedestrians, and includes that part of a highway between the curb line (or the edge of the roadway, where there is no curb line) and the adjacent property line, whether or not paved or improved;
39. "stop" means
- (a) when required, a complete cessation from vehicular movement, and
 - (b) when prohibited, any halting even momentarily of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a peace officer or traffic control device;
40. "traffic control device" means any sign, signal, marking or device placed, marked or erected under the authority of this Act for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding traffic;
41. "traffic control signal" means a traffic control device, whether manually, electrically or mechanically operated, by which traffic is directed to stop and to proceed;

42. "traffic lane" means
- (a) outside an urban area, a longitudinal division of a roadway into a strip of sufficient width to accommodate the passage of a single line of vehicles but does not mean a parking lane, and
 - (b) inside an urban area, longitudinal division of a roadway into a strip of sufficient width to accommodate the passage of a single line of vehicles, whether or not the division is indicated by lines on the road surface;
43. "trailer" means a vehicle so designed that it may be attached to or drawn by a motor vehicle and intended to transport property or persons and includes any trailer that is designed, constructed and equipped as a dwelling place, living abode or sleeping place, either permanently or temporarily, but does not include machinery or equipment used in the construction or maintenance of highways;
44. "truck" means a vehicle designed primarily for the transportation of property or equipment but does not include a chassis cab, crawler mounted vehicle, trailer, machinery or equipment used in the construction or maintenance of highways or an off-highway vehicle as defined in the Off-highway Vehicle Act;
45. "truck tractor" means a truck that is designed primarily for drawing another vehicle and that is not designed to carry any load other than part of the weight of the vehicle drawn, and includes a vehicle that is designed to accommodate a 5th wheel coupling, but does not include a crane equipment breakdown vehicle;
46. "urban area" means a city, town or village;
47. "vehicle" means a device in, on or by which a person or thing may be transported or drawn on a highway.

OPERATION OF VEHICLES

48. No person shall drive a vehicle in any lane of the Town at a speed in excess of 30 kilometers per hour.
Specified penalty \$75.00
49. No person shall drive a vehicle in any restricted and posted area set aside as a public park or playground except on a clearly defined roadway constructed for such vehicular traffic.
Specified penalty \$100.00
50. No person shall operate any vehicle upon any portion of the Grimshaw Airport Runway.
Specified penalty \$250.00
51. When repairs or alterations are in progress on or adjoining any roadway within the Town and such work is being indicated by barricades or signs or by a flagman, no person shall disregard the warning given thereby and every operator shall obey any signal of a flagman on duty at the site of the work.
Specified penalty \$75.00.
52. No person shall cause a disturbance with any vehicle or part thereof within the Town between the hours of 11:00 o'clock in the evening, and 7:00 o'clock of the next morning so as to disquiet or annoy residents.

53. The posted speed limit within the Town of Grimshaw shall be 50 kilometers per hour unless otherwise posted. Specified penalties to be applied as per the Highway Traffic Act fines.
54. No driver shall follow a fire truck or other emergency vehicle more closely than a distance of 200 feet. Specified penalty \$50.00
55. No person shall drive any vehicle over a fire hose except upon specific permission of an officer of the Fire Department at the scene. Specified penalty \$50.00
56. After an alarm of fire has been struck or sounded and until the fire department apparatus has arrived at the fire site, no person shall operate, drive, park or leave any vehicle in any location or in such a manner as to interfere with the operation or obstruct the passage of the Fire Department apparatus. Specified penalty \$100.00
57. No person shall operate engine retardant brakes within the limits of the Town of Grimshaw, at any hour of the day or night. Specified penalty \$100.00

RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF PEDESTRIANS

58. Pedestrians shall not crowd or jostle other pedestrians in such a manner as to create or cause discomfort, disturbance or confusion. Specified penalty \$25.00
59. (1) Three or more persons shall not stand in a group or so near to each other on any highway as to obstruct the entrance to buildings or to obstruct or prevent other persons using such highway; and forthwith upon request having been made by any Peace Officer shall disperse and move away.
- (2) No person shall stand, sit or lie on any highway in such a manner as to obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic or as to annoy, inconvenience, distress, or incommode any other person lawfully upon the highway. Specified penalty \$50.00
60. Nothing in Section 59 shall be construed as prohibiting the congregation or assembling of individuals to attend and listen to street preaching or public speaking so long as the proceedings are peaceable and orderly and sufficient space is left on the highway to allow of free movement of ordinary traffic; but, should any highway at or near such assembly become in consequence thereof so obstructed as to obstruct or impede such ordinary traffic, the persons so obstructing or impeding shall forthwith move away upon being requested to do so by any Peace Officer. Any person refusing or failing to forthwith move away upon being requested as aforesaid shall be guilty of a breach of this Bylaw. Specified penalty \$50.00
61. Nothing in Section 59 shall be construed as prohibiting the assembling of persons for the purpose of watching a parade or procession.
62. No person shall stand upon or walk along a roadway for the purpose of soliciting a ride from the driver of any vehicle. Specified penalty \$50.00

63. No person shall pass beyond a point designated by a Peace Officer or a member of the Fire Department near the location of a fire.
Specified penalty \$50.00
64. No person shall walk on, loiter or otherwise occupy any portion of the Grimshaw Airport runway.
Specified penalty \$50.00
- (1) This subsection shall not apply to Town personnel while doing authorized construction or maintenance work at the aforesaid location. Said work shall be done in a safe manner, with the use of flashing amber lights.

CYCLISTS

65. No person shall ride a bicycle on any sidewalk. Children's bicycles or tricycles having a wheel diameter of less than 500 millimeters are excepted from this provision.
Specified penalty \$20.00 and 15 days impoundment of bicycle.
66. No person shall leave or abandon a bicycle on any sidewalk or street in such a manner as to endanger pedestrians or obstruct vehicle traffic.
Specified penalty \$20.00 and 15 days impoundment of bicycle.

HORSEDRAWN VEHICLES

67. The driver or other person in charge of any horsedrawn vehicle on a highway shall remain upon such vehicle while it is in motion, or shall walk beside the horse drawing such vehicle.
Specified penalty \$25.00.
68. No person shall place or leave any horsedrawn vehicle unattended with, or without horses upon any highway so as to cause an obstruction.
Specified penalty \$25.00.
69. No person shall tie a horse to any post, hook or ring or in any way on a highway so as to obstruct traffic or cause danger to pedestrians.
Specified penalty \$25.00.

PARKING

70. No person shall park a vehicle upon any highway in such a manner that any part of the vehicle is within 244 centimeters of the center line of the highway whether or not such center line is marked on the highway, provided that the foregoing shall only apply to highways where the roadway is 9.5 meters or more in width.
Specified penalty \$50.00
71. Where a vehicle parking space is marked or designated upon a highway, every driver of a vehicle using the same shall park such vehicle wholly within the limits of the space.
Specified penalty \$25.00
72. Any vehicle parked on any highway within the Town, other than on such streets or avenues as are designated for angle parking, shall be parallel parked.

73. Unless specifically required or permitted by other provisions of this Bylaw, or by traffic signs or signals, or in compliance with the directions of a Peace Officer, or to avoid conflict with other traffic, no driver of any vehicle shall stop or park such vehicle:
- (1) Where the vehicle will in any way interfere with the use of a doorway intended as a fire or emergency exit from any building abutting the highway; or
 - (2) In the entranceway to the Town Fire Hall; or
 - (3) On any portion of the Grimshaw Airport runway or its approaches in the line of flight.
Specified penalty \$100.00 73. (1) (2) (3).
74. Parking in lanes or alleys shall not be permitted, but lanes and alleys may be used for the loading or unloading of goods or passengers from or on to a vehicle.
Specified penalty \$50.00
75. No person shall park a vehicle on private land unless such person has obtained the permission of the owner, tenant, occupant or person in charge of the said private land.
- (1) An owner, tenant, occupant or person in charge of private land if satisfied that any person is violating the prohibition set forth in Section 75 may report to a Peace Officer the license number and location of the illegally parked vehicle; any person making such a report shall give his name and address, and the Peace Officer shall investigate and have the vehicle towed or impounded, if the provisions of Section 6 subsection (g) has been violated.
Specified penalty \$100.00
76. No person shall park any vehicle upon any land owned by the Town which the said Town uses or permits to be used as a playground, recreation area or public parks, except on such part thereof as may be designated for vehicular parking.
Specified penalty \$50.00
77. No person shall park any unlicensed or licensed vehicle displayed for sale upon any Town owned property, Town owned parking lot, Town leased parking lot, or boulevard.
Specified penalty \$100.00
78. When a properly marked taxi stand has been established by Council, then no person shall park a vehicle that is not a taxi cab in such stand.
Specified penalty \$25.00
79. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Bylaw, the Town Foreman may cause fixed or moveable signs to be placed on or near a roadway, such signs to read "No Parking - Street Cleaning" or "No Parking Snow Removal" together with the day and times stated thereon.

- (1) After such signs are placed on or near a highway, No person shall park or leave a vehicle on the signed portion of highway during the restricted period of time indicated on the sign.
 - (a) Any vehicle that is on such roadway when such signs are placed thereon shall be removed by its owner or operator in accordance with the preceding section.
Specified Penalty \$25.00
 - (b) During posted times when any snow removal or street cleaning is to commence on said posted roadway, the owner of any vehicle found thereon may be charged with unlawful parking and the vehicle may be removed pursuant to Section 79 (a).
Specified Penalty \$25.00
 - (c) When it is practical, the vehicle, on removal from the roadway being cleaned, will be left nearby to minimize inconvenience and expense to its owner or operator.
80. Except when actually loading or unloading passengers, no person shall park a vehicle at the following locations:
 - (1) In a passenger loading or unloading space marked with a sign, or with designated curb markings.
Specified penalty \$25.00
81. No person shall park a vehicle on any portion of a highway marked by a sign designating "No Parking", except where such signs permit parking during specified time limits.
Specified penalty \$50.00
82. No person shall park any trailer, whether designed for occupancy by persons or for the carrying of goods or equipment, upon any highway unless the said trailer is attached to a vehicle by which it may be propelled or drawn and when so attached the trailer shall be deemed part of the vehicle and subject to the regulations pertaining to vehicles.
Specified penalty \$50.00
83. Vehicles shall be deemed to be abandoned under the following conditions:
 - (a) When a vehicle is left unoccupied upon a highway.
 - (b) When a vehicle is left upon public or private property without the express or implied consent of the owner or person in lawful possession or control of the property.
 - (c) When a vehicle is unoccupied, at a location referred to in subsection (a) or (b), for more than 72 consecutive hours it shall be deemed to have been abandoned at that location for the purposes of this bylaw.
 - (d) For application to this section "vehicle" includes a wrecked or partially dismantled vehicle or any part of a vehicle.
Specified penalty \$100.00 for 83 (a)(b)(c)
84. No person shall park a non conforming class of vehicle at a place or area where a sign indicates that parking there is restricted to a certain class of vehicle only, or for times specified.
Specified penalty \$100.00
85. No driver shall park a vehicle nearer than 30 meters to a fire truck while said fire truck is parked in answer to a fire call.
Specified penalty \$100.00

86. No person shall park a truck or vehicle, or a truck or vehicle with any type of trailer attached thereto upon any highway if the overall length of the truck or vehicle, or the truck or vehicle with trailer attached exceeds (ten) 10 meters, except on the following designated truck routes, as shown on Schedule "B" attached hereto:
- (1) Mackenzie Highway #2, within the Town Boundaries during posted times only.
 - (2) 58th Avenue, (Forbes)
 - (3) 57th Avenue, (Kennedy)
 - (4) West Service Road adjacent to Mackenzie Highway from 50th Avenue (Wilcox) to 42nd Avenue (Matheson).
 - (5) East Service Road adjacent to Mackenzie Highway from 57th Avenue (Kennedy) to North Boundary, Lot A, Plan 5275 K.S.
 - (6) 56th Street from 58th Avenue (Forbes) to 57th Avenue (Kennedy).
 - (7) 54th Street from 57th Avenue (Kennedy) thence southerly to the north boundary C.N.R. Railway Property.
 - (8) West Mackenzie Service Road, 60th Avenue, 53rd Street, and 63rd Avenue.
 - (9) 49th Street from 56th Avenue (Craddock) to 58th Avenue (Forbes).
- Specified Penalty \$100.00
87. No person shall park a truck or vehicle, or a truck or vehicle with any type of trailer attached thereto, upon any highway within a residential land use district of the Town of Grimshaw, as defined under Bylaw 733 and amendments thereto, where such vehicle shall
- (1) make, cause, or allow to be made any loud or unusual noise which may annoy, disturb, injure, endanger, or detract from the comfort, repose, health, peace, or safety of other persons, or
 - (2) make, cause, or allow to be made, or operate a vehicle from which engine, or cargo, fumes or vapours are produced which may annoy, disturb, injure, endanger, or detract from the comfort, repose, health, peace, or safety of other persons
- Specified penalty: Section 87 (1) or 87 (2) on first offence warning ticket, on second and subsequent offences \$100.00.
88. On the truck routes designated for parking in Section 86, a truck or vehicle, or a truck or vehicle with any type of trailer attached thereto, containing either flammable liquid or explosive materials, shall not park any closer than 50 feet to a building likely to contain persons or valuable goods.
Specified penalty \$200.00
- (1) This section shall not apply where a vehicle or trailer is required to be parked while making deliveries in the course of its ordinary business excepting that a warning signal device or notice shall be clearly displayed.
89. No person shall park a vehicle, in excess of 610 centimeters (20 feet) in total length on Main Street between 55th Avenue (Railway) and 50th Avenue (Wilcox Road).
Specified penalty \$50.00
90. A holiday trailer, private passenger bus or motor home is permitted to park on any highway, provided it is not parked for a period in excess of 72 hours, and providing that it is owned by a bona fide non-resident visitor or tourist.
Specified penalty \$50.00

TRUCK OPERATION AND ROUTES

91. The following roads are hereby designated as truck routes, as shown on Schedule "B-1" attached hereto:
- (1) 50th Avenue (Wilcox Road),
 - (2) Mackenzie Highway # 2, within the Town Boundaries,
 - (3) 55th Avenue (Railway)/Highway 2A from Mackenzie Highway to the north east Town limits,
 - (4) 58th Avenue, (Forbes)
 - (5) 57th Avenue, (Kennedy)
 - (6) 50th Street (Main) from 55th Avenue (Railway) to 47th Avenue (Byng), and from 56th Avenue (Craddock) to 57th Avenue (Kennedy)
 - (7) 47th Avenue (Byng) from 50th Street (Main) to Mackenzie Highway.
 - (8) 54th Avenue (Cattamach) from Mackenzie Highway to 50th Street (Main).
 - (9) 53rd Avenue (Scott) from 50th Avenue (Wilcox) to 50th Street (Main).
 - (10) West Service Road adjacent to Mackenzie Highway from 50th Avenue (Wilcox) to 42nd Avenue (Matheson).
 - (11) East Service Road adjacent to Mackenzie Highway from 57th Avenue (Kennedy) to the North Boundary, Lot A, Plan 5275 K.S.
 - (12) 54th Street from 57th Avenue (Kennedy) to 50th Avenue (Wilcox).
 - (13) 56th Street from 58th Avenue (Forbes) to 57th Avenue (Kennedy).
 - (14) Town Road allowances situated on the easterly and westerly Town Boundaries.
 - (15) West Mackenzie Service Road, 60th Avenue, 53rd Street, and 63rd Avenue.
 - (16) 49th Street from 56th Avenue (Craddock) to 58th Avenue (Forbes).
92. No person shall operate a heavy vehicle or truck tractor trailer combination on any highway not designated as a truck route. For the purposes of this section, a heavy vehicle means a vehicle with a total weight exceeding 10,300 kilograms, when either loaded or unloaded.
Specified Penalty \$100.00
- (1) The following shall not be deemed to be operating a vehicle in contravention of Section 92 above:
Persons delivering or collecting goods or merchandise to or from the premises of bona fide customers.
 - (2) if the loading or unloading is taking place as stated in Section 92 (1) when or where visibility is restricted then the vehicle and its trailer shall have all front and rear parking lights clearly illuminated.
Specified penalty \$50.00
93. No person shall operate a vehicle in excess of load limits as established from time to time, by resolution of Council, on any street or portion of streets within the Town. Such load limits shall apply and be posted as stated below:
- (1) Such load limits shall be indicated by a sign or signs posted along the prohibited route.
 - (2) Said posted load limits shall conform to the Alberta Motor Transport Act public vehicles regulations.
Specified penalty \$200.00

MISCELLANEOUS

94. No person shall plant or allow trees, hedges, or shrubs to grow on private property within 5 meters of a highway intersection, whether planted before or after the date of the passing of this Bylaw.
- (1) The owner, tenant or occupant of any land adjoining any highway or public place in the Town shall cause all trees, shrubs and bushes which overhang the sidewalk, highway, or public place to be properly trimmed and cut back, so as to prevent obstruction on the sidewalk, highway or public place to pedestrians or vehicles, and shall remove any branches falling from such overhanging trees, shrubs or bushes, or any trees which may be blown down, over or across any such sidewalk, highway or public place.
 - (2) The Council may require any person concerned to comply with the provisions of Section 94 hereof within thirty days of being notified to do so. If the person fails to comply with such notice, the Council may direct employees or agents of the Town to enter upon the private property to carry out the necessary work, and may charge the cost of so doing against the person in default.
 - (3) No person shall erect or cause to be erected, built or placed, a fence, wall or other object on private property within 5 meters of a highway intersection, so as to impede the clear visibility required to conduct safe traffic movement.
95. Where a person is given a notice pursuant to Section 94, that person shall have the right to appeal said notice to Council within 14 days of the date of the mailing of the notice, by submitting the appeal in writing to the Secretary of the Town of Grimshaw.
96. No person shall ride or permit any other person to ride on the outside of a motor vehicle.
Specified penalty \$50.00
- (1) Section 96 does not apply to a person riding
 - (a) on a regular seat on a motor cycle, or
 - (b) in the box of a truck, or
 - (c) in or on any fire-fighting vehicle, or
 - (d) in or on a vehicle engaged in highway construction or maintenance.
97. No person shall place any sign, notice, furniture, appliance, vehicle, or structure or other thing upon a Town highway or boulevard or upon abutting Town property including public walks unless authorized by the Town Development Officer to do so.
- (1) Any sign, notice or other object placed in contravention of this section shall be liable to removal and immediate disposal by the Town without any notice or warning to the owner thereof.
98. No person or Business shall wash a vehicle upon a paved highway or so near a paved highway as to result in depositing mud or creating slush or ice upon a public sidewalk or paved roadway.
Specified Penalty \$25.00

99. No person shall drain vehicle fluids upon a highway so that the contents fall upon a paved highway.
Specified penalty \$100.00
100. No person shall in any way injure or destroy any tree, shrub, flower or grass on any grass plot, street, park, playground or public place in the Town.
Specified penalty \$100.00
101. Snow and ice removal from Town sidewalk shall be the responsibility of the property owner and shall be regulated as follows:
- (1) Within a period of seventy two (72) hours after the end of a storm or other weather condition that has left the streets covered with snow or ice, the occupant of every business premises with any portion of the premises abutting a Town sidewalk shall take reasonable measures to make the portion of the public sidewalk on the front and the flank of his property safe for pedestrians. The foregoing shall not be construed to relieve pedestrians from the duty of due care.
Specified penalty \$50.00
- (2) When the Town Foreman considers that an occupant of business premises has failed to meet the requirements of this section, then the occupant may be advised that, failing immediate improvement of the sidewalk condition, the Town may undertake the necessary work and will charge the cost thereof to the occupant of the abutting property. Such charge shall be payable to the Town in addition to any penalties imposed for non-compliance with the provisions of this section.
102. No person shall cause any damage to any sidewalk in the Town by striking, picking or cutting the same with any shovel, pick, crowbar or other metal tool, whether such person is engaged in removing snow or ice from such sidewalk or not.
Specified penalty \$50.00
103. No person shall litter a highway, park, playground or public place.
- (1) In this section, "litter" means deposit or cause or allow to be deposited any wood, gravel, earth, glass, garbage, rubbish or other material whether forming any part of the load of a vehicle or not.
Specified penalty \$100.00
104. No occupant of any premises shall permit the unrestricted flow of any water from eavestroughs or gutter spouts from such premises on to a public sidewalk or boulevard in such a manner as to endanger public safety.
Specified penalty \$100.00
105. No owner or possessor of any animal which has died shall allow the same to lie on any street, lane or public place in the Town and, in case such animal shall have died on any street lane or public place, such owner or possessor, as the case may be, shall at once cause the carcass to be removed within twenty-four (24) hours.
Specified penalty \$50.00
106. No owner, tenant or occupier of any residential property or any other person shall erect, construct, maintain, use or permit to remain upon or along the boundary of his lane or premises, near any street or highway in the Town, any fence wholly constructed of barbed wire.
- (1) Where a chain link security fence is partly constructed with barbed wire, the barbed wire part shall be no closer than 2 meters in height, from the existing ground elevation.
Specified penalty \$100.00

107. No person shall drive, propel, tow or move on any surface or oil treated highway any vehicle having caterpillar treads, or tracks, metal spikes, lugs or cleats without first laying down planks or tires to protect the pavement, sidewalks and curbs. Specified penalty \$250.00
108. No person shall remove a wrecked or damaged vehicle from a highway without removing glass or any other injurious substance or thing dropped upon the highway from the vehicle. Specified penalty \$50.00
109. No person shall remove, throw down, deface or alter, injure or destroy a traffic control sign or device placed, marked or erected upon a Town highway. Specified penalty \$250.00
110. In a prosecution for contravening any section of this Bylaw, the existence of a traffic control device is prima facie proof that the device was properly designated and erected by the Town.
111. Onus will be placed on the owner of a vehicle to prove to the satisfaction of the magistrate or judge trying the case that at the time of the offense the motor vehicle involved was not being driven, or was not parked, or left by him, or by any other person with his consent, express or implied.
- (1) The word "owner" as used in this section means in the case of a vehicle registered pursuant to the Highway Traffic Act the person named on the certificate of registration.

AUTHORITY OF MUNICIPAL SECRETARY
AND TOWN MANAGER

112. The Council hereby delegates to the Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager the authority to prescribe where traffic signals, traffic signs, stop signs, yield signs, speed limit signs or other similar signs for controlling and regulating traffic in public places are to be located. The Council directs that a record of such locations shall be kept which shall be open to public inspection during normal business hours.
113. Without restricting the generality of the foregoing section, the Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate any highway for through traffic purposes. Such Highway shall be properly marked with stop signs or yield signs at all intersections of such highway.
114. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate crosswalks upon any highway and to have same marked.
115. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate:
- (1) Any highway as one which is closed temporarily in whole or in part to traffic and shall cause such highway to be so posted.
- (2) Any area as one in which parking privileges are temporarily suspended and shall cause such area to be so posted.
116. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate any roadway as one to be divided into traffic lanes of such number as he considers proper and that which is consistent with current accepted engineering practices.

117. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate "School Zones" and "Playgrounds Zones" and shall cause such zones to be marked by signs posted along the highway, or by markings on the pavement, or both. The Council directs that a record of such locations shall be kept which shall be open to public inspection during normal office hours.
118. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate vehicle speed on any highway or portion of a highway in a state of disrepair and shall cause the same to be posted.
119. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate any portion of a street upon which parking will be restricted and shall cause signs to be erected thereon providing that the abutting sidewalk is not obstructed.
120. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate handicapped, passenger, or truck loading or unloading zones and shall cause the same to be posted.
121. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate distances from any intersection within which distance no parking shall be permitted for compliance with any provision of this Bylaw.
122. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to designate portions of any highway where parking is limited to a period of time and shall cause signs to be erected indicating such parking limitations.
123. The Municipal Secretary and/or Town Manager is hereby authorized to specify the types of vehicles which are prohibited from parking on any Town-owned parking lot or park and shall cause signs to be erected at appropriate locations setting forth such prohibitions.

AUTHORITY OF TOWN COUNCIL

124. With respect to highways under this direction, control and management, the Council of a municipality may make bylaws, not inconsistent with the Highway Traffic Act and on matters for which no provision is made, for the regulation and control of vehicle, animal and pedestrian traffic and, without restricting the generality of the foregoing, may make bylaws.
 - (1) restricting the weight of vehicles or of vehicles with their loads using the highways or any particular highway in the municipality;
 - (a) controlling and regulating the use of all highways, sidewalks and other public places and delegating to the chief constable or municipal commissioners or municipal manager any powers in connection therewith;
 - (2) delegating to the municipal commissioners or any municipal official or employee named in the bylaw, the power to prescribe where traffic control devices are to be located, including traffic control devices restricting the speed of vehicles, providing that traffic control devices located by those persons pursuant to a delegation made under this clause shall be deemed to have been made by bylaw of the municipality and providing for a record of all the locations to be kept which shall be open to public inspection during normal business hours;
 - (a) classifying motor vehicles and other vehicles and pedestrians for any and all purposes involving the use of streets, lanes and other public places;

- (3) preventing or restricting, controlling and regulating
 - (a) the parking of vehicles or of any particular class or classes of vehicles on all or any highways and other public places or any portion thereof, and authorizing any person enforcing its parking laws to place an erasable chalk mark on the tread face of the tire of a parked or stopped vehicle without that person or the municipality incurring a liability for doing so,
 - (b) the parking on specified highways or within a certain distance from any building, or any class or classes of vehicles or of vehicles used for carrying inflammable, combustible, explosive or other dangerous material, whether loaded or unloaded, and defining the route or routes through the municipality that those vehicles must follow in entering or traversing the municipality and prohibiting them from travelling on any designated highway, bridge, overpass or subway;
 - (c) any other use of the highways and other public places or any portion thereof by or for vehicles or any particular classification of vehicles;
- (4) regulating and controlling the manner and method of entering and leaving private property on which the parking of vehicles is permitted by the person in possession of the private property of persons other than his relatives, either for profit or otherwise;
- (5) defining what constitutes objectionable noise, devising a system or method of determining or measuring that noise, and prohibiting the operation of motor vehicles which in any manner make objectionable noise;
- (6) prohibiting right or left turns at any designated intersection;
- (7) establishing, acquiring, operating, controlling and regulating parking stands and places for parking vehicles or any class or classes of vehicles on any highway or other public place or on any municipal land designated in the bylaw as parking stands or places and assigning any particular stand or place to be specific person or persons;
- (8) prescribing a tariff of fees or charges to be paid by persons using those parking stands or places, which fees or charges may vary according to the location, the classification of the vehicles for which they are intended or as the Council may otherwise determine, and in its discretion granting free use of all or any parking stands or places for all vehicles or any particular classification of vehicles for any period of time or during any hours that may be specified in the bylaw;
- (9) establishing, controlling and regulating a parking meter system or providing in any other manner for the collection of fees or charges payable by persons using the parking stands or places;
- (10) preventing the encumbering of streets and other public places by vehicles and other articles;
- (11) providing for the impounding and removal from a highway, street, alley, parking lot or other public place of a vehicle in respect of which charges have not been paid or of a vehicle parked in contravention of a bylaw or regulation;

- (12) controlling or preventing the riding of bicycles on any sidewalk;
- (13) providing for the licensing of owners of bicycles, prescribing regulations with respect thereto and controlling and regulating the operation and parking of bicycles on highways and other public places;
- (14) providing for the seizure or impounding for a period not exceeding 15 days of any bicycle used or operated in contravention of any bylaw;
- (15) regulating parades or processions over and along any highways within the municipality, and prohibiting the passage of any parade or procession over any or all highways within the municipality unless and until a permit for the passage has been issued by the Mayor, or the Council by resolution has expressly permitted it;
- (16) closing or restricting the use of any highway, subway, bridge or overpass or part of any highway, subway, bridge or overpass within the municipality either as to the full width of it or as to part of the width of it with respect to any class or classes of vehicles or with respect to any class or classes of pedestrians, and providing for the proper enforcement of any such closing either by way of the erection of barricades or by the adoption of any other means the Council considers necessary or expedient;
- (17) granting a license or permit for the temporary occupation or use of a road allowance, public highway, or a portion of a road allowance or highway when it is not required for public use, if the license or permit is terminable on 30 days' notice in writing;
- (18) permitting persons, subject to any conditions and restrictions that the bylaw may provide, to park their motor vehicles on the highway
 - (a) adjacent to or in the vicinity of the land on which they reside, or
 - (b) in a zone or area in which is situated the land of which they reside,notwithstanding any general or specific prohibitions or restrictions on parking relating to that highway;
- (19) providing that vehicular or pedestrian traffic shall travel on any highway or part of any highway of the municipality only in one direction as the Council may in the interests of safety and convenience prescribe;
- (20) prohibiting a class or classes of motor vehicles from using wholly or partially or for a certain period or periods a highway within a municipality;
- (21) prohibiting and regulating crossing and walking along highways by pedestrians;
- (22) notwithstanding Section 14, of the Highway Traffic Act prescribing a maximum speed limit applicable to all alleys in the municipality;
- (23) providing for the placing on a vehicle parked in contravention of this Act or bylaw of a parking tag in the form prescribed by the municipality, allowing the payment of a penalty to the municipality in lieu of prosecution for the offense and setting the penalty applicable to each such offense;

- (24) delegating to the chief constable or municipal commissioners or municipal manager the power to engage members of the Canadian Corps of Commissioners to issue and place on vehicles parked in contravention of this Act or a bylaw passed under this section the parking tags authorized under clause (w);
 - (25) restricting the use of a highway in whole or in part to a particular class of vehicle;
 - (26) designating truck routes.
125. The Council of a municipality may make bylaws not inconsistent with this Act and for which no provision is made in this Act,
- (1) preventing or restricting, controlling and regulating the parking of vehicles or any particular classes of vehicles in privately owned trailer parks,
 - (2) prohibiting the owner of a vehicle or the person in charge of a vehicle from parking or leaving the vehicle on private property without authority from the owner, tenant, occupant or person in charge or control of the private property and providing for
 - (a) the impounding or removal from the private property of a vehicle so parked or left on it without authority, and
 - (b) the laying of an information and complaint against the owner or person in charge of the illegally parked vehicle for the parking offense, and
 - (3) prescribing speed limits on lanes or other thoroughfares prepared for the use of vehicle in privately owned trailer parks.
126. Except when an Act specifically enacts to a contrary effect, no municipality has any power to pass, enforce or maintain any bylaw
- (1) requiring from any owner or operator of a motor vehicle, any tax, fee, license or permit for the use of the public highways,
 - (2) excluding any of such persons from the free use of the public highways,
 - (3) that in any way affects the registration or numbering of motor vehicles, or
 - (4) forbidding the use of the public highways contrary to or inconsistent with the Highway Traffic Act.
127. The Council of an urban area may, by bylaw, establish a commission, to be known as a parking authority, and give it power
- (1) to operate all or any off-street parking areas, structures or facilities owned by the municipality or established on land to which the municipality has title, and
 - (2) to enter into agreements with any person for the construction, operation or management of off-street parking areas, structures or facilities, whether or not the municipality owns the land or has an interest in it.

AUTHORITY OF POLICE

128. Any Peace Officer is hereby authorized to remove or cause to be removed any vehicle or trailer pursuant to Sections 92, and 93 of Motor Vehicle Administration Act, Chapter M-22, R.S.A. 1980, and amendments thereto, and the provision of this Bylaw.
- (1) Such vehicle may be removed to a place designated by Council where it will remain impounded until claimed by the owner thereof or his agent. A vehicle removed in accordance with Section 79, Subsection (1) (c) of this Bylaw shall be deemed not to be impounded.
 - (2) No impounded vehicle shall be released to its owner or his agent until the impounding charge sufficient to meet the reasonable towing and storage charges have been paid; such charges shall be in addition to any fine or penalty imposed in respect of any violation or infraction of a provision of this bylaw.
129. The specified penalty required to be paid shall be as stated in each applicable section or subsection of this Bylaw, and shall be so specified on all violation tickets issued under the provisions of this Bylaw.
130. For the purposes of assigning the authority to enforce the provisions of this bylaw the following shall apply mutatis mutandis:
- (1) Municipal Police Service - means the aggregate of resources and member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Force in the Municipality employed pursuant to the agreement entered into between the Town of Grimshaw and the Government of Canada for the enforcement of the Criminal Code, Provincial Statutes and Municipal Bylaws except resources, members and support staff employed primarily in:
 - (a) The enforcement of federal statutes other than the Criminal Code,
 - (b) National Police Services,
 - (c) The maintenance of national security,
 - (d) Services provided to or on behalf of Federal Government Departments,
 - (2) The member in charge of the Unit shall:
 - (a) In enforcing Bylaw of the Municipality, act under the lawful authority designated under the term of the agreement entered into between the Town of Grimshaw and the Government of Canada.
 - (3) The internal management of the Municipal Police Services, including administration and the application of professional police procedures, shall remain under the control of Canada.
 - (a) Nothing in this agreement shall be interpreted as limiting in any way the powers, duties and responsibilities of the Attorney General relating to the administration of justice within the province.
 - (b) direction of the Chief Executive of the Municipality, or such person as may be designated in writing for this purpose by the Chief Executive, and

- (c) report as often as requested to the Chief Executive of the Municipality, or to such person as may be designated in writing for this purpose by the Chief Executive, on the subject of law enforcement in the Municipality.
- (4) Subject to section (c) subsection (3) the R.C.M.P. shall perform in the Municipality the normal duties of peace officers and render such services as are necessary to
 - (a) preserve the peace, prevent crimes and offenses against the laws of Canada, and the laws in effect in the province and municipality, apprehend criminals and offenders and others who may be lawfully taken into custody;
 - (b) execute all warrants, and perform all duties and services in relation thereto, that may, under the laws of Canada, the Province or the Municipality, be executed and performed by peace officers;
- 131. The R.C.M.P. are hereby authorized to render the services necessary to enforce the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act, Chapter H-7, R.S.A. 1980 and amendments and regulations there-to within the corporate boundaries of the Town of Grimshaw, pursuant to the memorandum of Agreement entered into between the Town of Grimshaw and the Government of Canada.
- 132. Each Peace Officer is hereby charged with the duty of enforcing the provisions of this Bylaw.
- 133. In enforcing the provisions of this Bylaw, any Peace Officer is hereby authorized to place a chalk mark on the tread face of the tire of a parked or stopped vehicle without that person or the Town incurring any liability for doing so.
- 134. In addition to any penalty provided in this Bylaw, any Peace Officer may impound any bicycle or motor cycle (as defined in Highway Traffic Act) for a minimum of five (5) or a maximum of fifteen (15) days if the operator has contravened any of the provisions of this Bylaw, except as otherwise provided for under the Motor Transport Act, or the Highway Traffic Act.
- 135. For the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this bylaw, the Provincial Offences Procedures Act R.S.A. 1988, being Chapter P-21.5, of the Province of Alberta, and amendments thereto shall apply.
- 136. Every person who is convicted of an offence under the provisions of this bylaw or is in default of payment of any specified penalty applicable thereto, is liable to imprisonment for a term of no less than 5 days, and not more than 6 months or liable to a fine of not less than the specified penalty applicable and not more than \$2,000.00.
- 137. Any fine or penalty imposed under this Bylaw shall enure to the benefit of the Town of Grimshaw.
- 138. The R.C.M.P. are hereby authorized to render the services necessary to enforce the provisions of Section 7, of this Bylaw under the Motor Transport Act, Chapter M-20 R.S.A. 1980 pursuant to the Memorandum of Agreement entered into between the Town of Grimshaw and the Government of Canada.

AUTHORITY OF FIRE
AND UTILITY DEPARTMENTS

139. Where a Peace Officer is not present at the scene of a fire or emergency, any member of the Grimshaw Volunteer Fire Department may direct traffic to:
- (1) ensure orderly movement of traffic, or
 - (2) prevent injury or damage to persons or property, or
 - (3) permit rescue action in an emergency.
140. Where required to do so for the purpose of carrying out his duties as a member of the Grimshaw Volunteer Fire Department, a fireman may drive and park a motor vehicle contrary to the provisions of this Bylaw if in the interest of fire fighting and public safety, it is necessary, and safe to do so.
141. The provisions of this Bylaw with respect to stopping and parking shall not apply during a fire or emergency to the following: (1) Municipal or Provincial utility vehicles, (2) Public Utility Corporation vehicles, (3) Town employee vehicles while actually engaged in work requiring them to be stopped and parked in contravention of any such provisions. This exemption shall not relieve the operator of any such vehicle from due care to clearly indicate the presence of such vehicle on any highway while so parked or stopped.

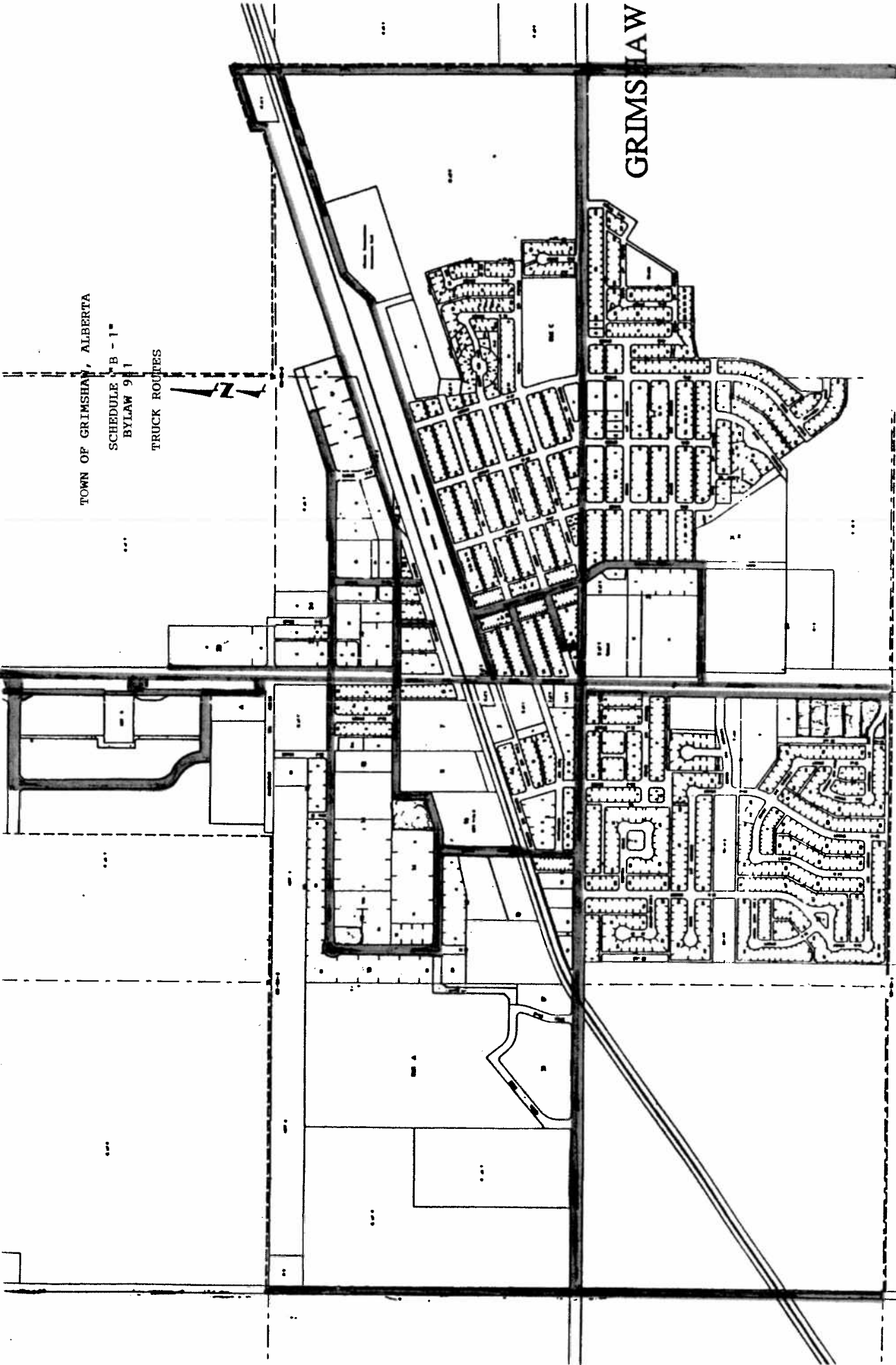

TRUCK ROUTES

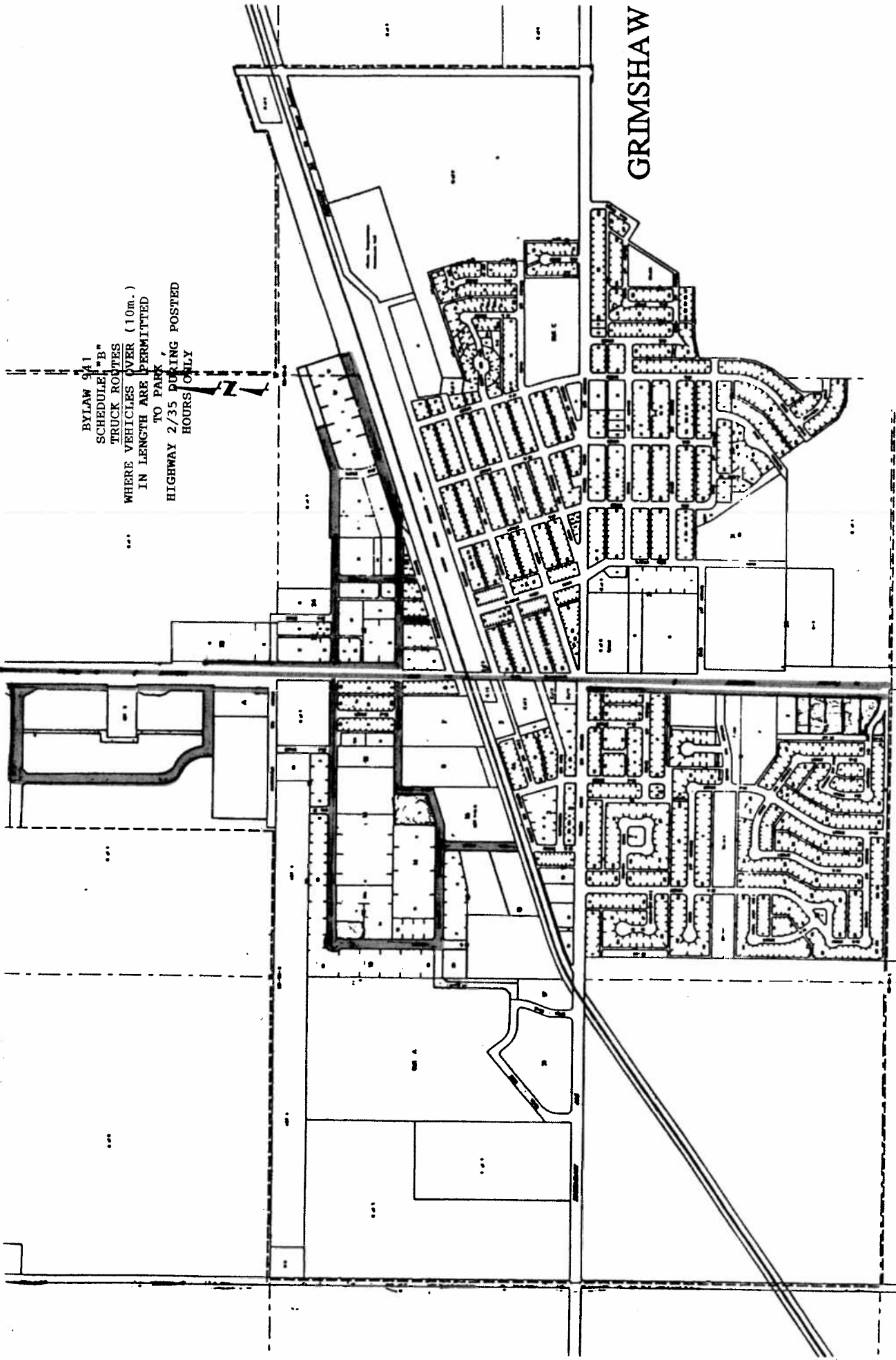

BYLAW 1004

A Bylaw to amend Bylaw 941, the Town of Grimshaw Traffic Control and Management Bylaw, this being amendment No. 2.

WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Grimshaw deems it expedient to amend Bylaw 941, and

WHEREAS this amendment does not change the intent of Bylaw 941,

NOW THEREFORE pursuant to the authority of the Municipal Government Act, Section 110, 153 and 172 (3), Chapter M-26, R.S.A. 1980 and amendments thereto; the Highway Traffic Act, Section 16, Chapter H-7 R.S.A. 1980 and amendments thereto; and the Motor Transport Act, section 14, Chapter M-20, R.S.A. 1980 and amendments thereto, the Council of the Town of Grimshaw hereby enacts as follows:

Section A – ITEM 65 and ITEM 72

CYCLISTS, or SKATEBOARDERS

65. No person shall ride a bicycle or utilize a skateboard on any sidewalk. Children's bicycles or tricycles having a wheel diameter of less than 500 millimeters are excepted from this provision.

Specified penalty \$20.00 and 15 days impoundment of equipment.

72. a) Any vehicle parked on any highway within the Town, other than on such Streets or Avenues as are designated for angle parking, shall be parallel parked.

Specified penalty: \$25.00


- b) No person shall park upon a two-way roadway other than the right side of the roadway and with the right hand wheels parallel to that side.

Specified penalty: \$25.00

Effective upon the date of the third and final reading of this Bylaw, Bylaw No. 1003 is rescinded.

Read a first, second and third time and finally passed in Council this 27th day of May, A.D. 1998.
